

Evidence Collection Procedures

Evidence 2: Depth of Content Knowledge

K-6: Satisfactory product due to Instructor of EDUC 220 by last day of classes of the semester enrolled in EDUC 220. EDUC 220 course grade is impacted by this product.

All others besides K-6: Satisfactory product due to licensure area coordinator by last day of classes of the semester enrolled in the capstone content course. In the case of 6-9 English, Social Studies, and Math; 6-9 and 9-12 Science; 6-9 and/or 9-12 post-bacs; or any other candidate not required to take the course or complete the competency in which Evidence 2 is completed, the candidate must submit a product from their undergraduate work to the licensure area coordinator for evaluation using the approved rubric by the end of the second week of the semester enrolled in the capstone 38x level methods course).

Instructors and licensure area coordinators submit products and rubrics for each student to Elaine Dye by the time grades are due for that semester.

Instructor and licensure area coordinators submit spreadsheets of pre and post results to Director of Candidate Assessment, Kim Brown, by time grades are due for that semester.

Candidates will not be able to student teach if Evidence 2 is not successfully completed and submitted to the designated person by the time grades are due during their 38x semester.

Evidence 3: Pedagogy (Unit Plan)

Satisfactory product due to Instructor of EDUC 38x by the last day of classes of the semester enrolled in EDUC 38x.

Instructor submits products and rubrics for each student to Elaine Dye by the time grades are due for that semester.

Instructor submits spreadsheets of pre and post results to Director of Candidate Assessment, Kim Brown, by the time grades are due for that semester.

Candidates will not be able to student teach if the unit plan is not successfully completed and electronically submitted to the 38x instructor by the time grades are due for that semester.

Evidences 5 and 6:

Satisfactory product due to instructor of EDUC 456 by the last day of classes during the semester enrolled in EDUC 456.

Instructor of EDUC 456 submits products and rubrics for each student to Elaine Dye by the time grades are due for that semester.

Instructor submits spreadsheets of pre and post results to Director of Candidate Assessment, Kim Brown, by time grades are due for that semester.

Candidates will not be recommended for licensure if the evidences are not successfully completed and electronically submitted to the 456 instructor by the time grades are due for that semester.
